The SBC shows you how you and the [plan](#) would share the cost for covered health care services. **NOTE: Information about the cost of this [plan](#) (called the [premium](#)) will be provided separately. <p>What is the overall deductible?</p>	<p>\$400 person / \$800 family In-network \$800 person / \$1,600 family Out-of-network</p>	<p>Generally, you must pay all the costs from providers up to the deductible amount before this plan begins to pay. If you have other family members on the plan, each family member must meet their own individual deductible until the total amount of deductible expenses paid by all family members meets the overall family deductible.</p>
<p>Are there services covered before you meet your deductible?</p>	<p>Yes. Preventive care services are covered before you meet your deductible.</p>	<p>This plan covers some items and services even if you haven't yet met the deductible amount. But a copayment or coinsurance may apply. For example, this plan covers certain preventive services without cost sharing and before you meet your deductible. <p>Are there other deductibles for specific services?</p>	<p>No.</p>	<p>You don't have to meet deductibles for specific services.</p>
<p>What is the out-of-pocket limit for this plan?</p>	<p>\$2,000 person / \$4,000 family In-network \$3,000 person / \$6,000 family Out-of-network</p>	<p>The out-of-pocket limit is the most you could pay in a year for covered services. If you have other family members in this plan, they have to meet their own out-of-pocket limits until the overall family out-of-pocket limit has been met.</p>
<p>Are there other out-of-pocket limits for specific services?</p>	<p>Yes, Pharmacy \$4,350 person / \$8,700 family</p>	<p>The calendar year maximum out-of-pocket limit applies to pharmacy claims only. Each individual family member must meet the single out-of-pocket limit unless the family out-of-pocket limit has been met. Once met, your covered prescriptions are paid at 100%. Generic dispense as written penalties do not apply to the out-of-pocket limit.</p>
<p>What is not included in the out-of-pocket limit?</p>	<p>Penalties, premiums, balance billing charges, and health care this plan doesn't cover.</p>	<p>Even though you pay these expenses, they don't count toward the out-of-pocket limit.</p>

<p>Will you pay less if you use a network provider?</p>	<p>Yes. See www.umar.com or call 1-800-826-9781 for a list of network providers.</p>	<p>This plan uses a provider network. You will pay less if you use a provider in the plan's network. You will pay the most if you use an out-of-network provider, and you might receive a bill from a provider for the difference between the provider's charge and what your plan pays (balance billing). Be aware, your network provider might use an out-of-network provider for some services (such as lab work). Check with your provider before you get services.</p>
<p>Do you need a referral to see a specialist?</p>	<p>No.</p>	<p>You can see the specialist you choose without a referral.</p>

Does this [plan](#) Provide Minimum Essential Coverage? Yes

[Minimum Essential Coverage](#) generally includes [plans](#), [health insurance](#) available through the [Marketplace](#) or other individual market policies, Medicare, Medicaid, CHIP, TRICARE, and certain other coverage. If you are eligible for certain types of [Minimum Essential Coverage](#), you may not be eligible for the [premium tax credit](#).

Does this [plan](#) Meet the Minimum Value Standard? Yes
